#### **MEMBERSHIP**

Recently, we have welcomed two new faith-based organizations as THEE Alliance Founding members. They are: St Michael Lutheran Church in Roseville

This means that we now have 16 Minnesota faith-based organizations that have made the commitment to give so generously to RIP during this past year. In addition, we have reached out to 22 faith-based organizations, many of whom have expressed interest in being part of this wonderful mission in 2022. We look forward to broadening our Christian and Non-Christian communities of faith, including Jewish, Muslim, and Buddhist communities. Together, we are well on our way of bringing a diverse group together in Minnesota to forgive \$100,000,000 in medical debt over the next 3 years. A heartfelt thank you to our organizations and their members for helping to make this possible.

### **METRICS**

December and January brought amazing results through your commitment and passion for helping others. Total gifts given to date, total dollars forgiven, and number of families impacted have nearly doubled in this brief period. As of 1/10/2022 there has been over \$244,000 raised toward our \$1,000,000 goal, medical debt forgiven is estimated to be over \$30 million, and you have made an impact on nearly 15,000 families. ## **UPDATES**

RIP continues to work with key hospital organizations in Minnesota and with the Minnesota Hospital Association and RIP is confident that they will be accessing debt directly from several Minnesota hospitals soon after the new year.

The Advisory group has added three new members to our team: Pastor Danielle Bartz, Al Albrecht, and Cheryl Myhr. Danielle is Pastor at First Congregational in Winona and helped lead the "Winona 5" Faith Leaders that gave \$15,000, forgiving \$2.3 million of medical debt for 1057 families. They are welcome additions as we look at 2022 strategies for RIP and THEE Alliance. All have a passion for medical debt forgiveness and will bring terrific ideas on how to broaden our reach for new members and awareness.

#### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

We have seen just how word of mouth can make an enormous impact in bringing to light the efforts by faith-based groups and the resulting impact it has made for families burdened with medical debt issues. Our members from Winona have done a wonderful job, sharing information about THEE Alliance and RIP. With their efforts, other churches in Southern Minnesota have joined in this stewardship as well. We have seen people across the entire United States make donations through THEE Alliance just because they have heard about us through family members from our Founding Members.

As wonderful leaders in this project, we are asking that you consider reaching out to a neighboring faith-based group or just a friend to let them know what you have done and what they could do as well. We view this as an "EACH ONE, ASK ONE" campaign.
